














A LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

2017 PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS




MISSION

RESOURCE CENTER

- 1,000 + clients came through the Resource Center
- 211 new clients
- 511 walk-in's supported



GETTING AHEAD

- 12 graduates of the 15 week class
- Mentoring started in 2018 with a focus on "Money and Me"
- Graduates moved on to Connections, a mentorship program to carryout life goals

LOAN PROGRAMS



- 300 + pieces of medical equipment were loaned out of our Medical Loan Closet
- 175 bikes were repaired to loan or sell through our Bicycle Ministry, and 7 were loaned to clients in 2017

THRIFT STORE



- 38% sales growth
- Donors purchased us a new delivery truck
- An eBay site was created to best steward valuable donations



2017 Revenue Sources






2017 EXPENSE BREAKDOWN

INNOVATIVE PROGRAMS



We are always listening for next steps from God. We seek to serve clients with a variety of innovative and transformative programs to help them stabilize their resources.

WELL WORKS



- We hired Rich Kackmarynski in September 2017 to direct Well Works
- Ring-O-Matic became our first customer with production starting in 2018
- Our goal is 500 hours of work per week, and 25 participants by the end of 2018

ACTS: A CALL TO SERVE MINISTRIES



- ACTS allows people to lend a hand to those that need it
- 60+ projects completed in 2017 in and around Marion County
- Service Surge was cancelled in 2017 due to the transition, but will take place in 2018 under the name Transform.

NAMI: NATIONAL ALLIANCE ON MENTAL ILLNESS

PARTNER ORGANIZATIONS



Partner organizations of The Well share the same objectives and serve clients in a variety of ways. Our partner organizations are separate community based organizations located at The Well Campus. We believe there is power in partnering together!

PELLA COMMUNITY FOOD SHELF



- 500 families are served per year
- An average of 1400 individuals are fed per month
- Open Tuesdays 8-9 am and 6:30-8 pm. Call 641-780-1779

CONGREGATE MEALS



- Daily 25 + seniors gather M-F for a meal, which rose from 10 daily-largest group 115
- Meals are provided by Marion County Senior Nutrition, and served by our volunteers who also deliver Meals on Wheels



GOOD SAMARITAN FREE MEDICAL CLINIC

- Serve 100+ people a year
- Open 1st and 3rd Thursday from 6-7 pm No appointments needed.



FOOT CARE AND BLOOD PRESSURE CLINIC

- Serves 10-20 seniors every other month from 8-11 am.

VOLUNTEERS



Volunteers are a vital part of making our ministry run smoothly. Each volunteer attends a training, completes a background check, and is assigned to an area to leverage their gifts. We are blessed with over 300 active volunteers!

- 10,000 + volunteers hours were logged in 2017

- 1,500 + volunteer hours were logged in 2017
