

IMPORTANCE OF GOVERNANCE









IN LOVING MEMORY



Memorials are gifts given in memory of someone who has passed away. Each person listed below are great friends of The Well. We remember who they were and the great impact they continue to have for the Kingdom, even after their passing.

MARY MOSS

- We were sad to learn that on September 12, 2020 Mary had passed away.
- Mary was a secretary at Diamond Vogel Paint and Wax for 35 years before retiring in 2009. Her favorite hobbies were embroidery, making puzzles, and playing games. In 1982, Mary was widowed at age 39, and she moved to Pella in 2016. She was a member of Trinity Reformed Church in Orange City, and a member of Third Reformed Church in Pella.

DR. STEWART F. KANIS

- We were sad to learn that on November 2, 1929 had passed away.
- Dr. Kanis and Dr. Gene Van Zee, also a graduate of University of Iowa College of Medicine, established the Pella Medical Center. The medical center grew from two to approximately 20 physicians, including many specialties. Dr. Kanis retired in 2002. During his career, he received the award "Physician of the Year" from Blank Pediatric Hospital in Des Moines, Iowa. His advice to medical students today was "listen to the patient, be completely dedicated to the Art of Medicine." Stewart was a loving husband and father and was blessed with 10 grandchildren and 11 great-grandchildren whom he greatly enjoyed and loved. He also enjoyed his medical partners and church families.
